- The Spanish language concentration may be completed with a combination of Cedar Crest Spanish courses and courses offered by the College's affiliated providers, the Lehigh Valley Association of Independent Colleges (LVAIC) and Acadeum.
- Completion of these courses qualifies students for a major in Spanish. Please declare the major with the Registrar. Consult with the Spanish program advisor with questions about acceptable substitutes for required SPA courses at Cedar Crest or LVAIC institutions.
- To apply transfer credits toward the completion of the concentration, students must have earned a grade of "C-" or better in each course to be transferred. Students must maintain a 3.0 overall GPA in courses taken for the concentration in order to be eligible for student teaching.
- Courses completed more than ten years ago will not be accepted for purposes of completing the requirements for the Foreign Language (Spanish) concentration.
- Spanish certification candidates who are scheduled to student teach must be formally evaluated in oral proficiency before their student teaching semester. Students must achieve a minimum level of Advanced Low on this evaluation. Contact the Spanish program advisor to arrange for this evaluation in the semester prior to the student teaching semester.
