The ADA is a federal civil rights law that prohibits discrimination against people with disabilities in everyday activities. It guarantees everyone the same opportunities to enjoy employment, purchase goods and services, and participate in state & local programs, including college. It governs our work, in conjunction with Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and state law.

Student Rights

- To choose whether or not to disclose a disability to the college
- To request appropriate accommodations to gain equal **access** to the same opportunities as peers without disabilities
- Expectation of confidentiality
- Non-discrimination

Understanding the law can aid you in being a successful self-advocate!



Student Responsibilities

- Meet with the Student Accessibility Services (SAS) office to self-disclose a disability
- Provide proper documentation
- Request accommodations needed for **access**
- Work with faculty & staff to implement accommodations
- Meet the academic standards of your program

Students must take an active role in their own success!

Accommodations can be used at the student's discretion. They do not need to be used everywhere all the time.

COMMUNICATION IS VITAL!

Faculty Responsibilities

- Refer students who disclose a disability to SAS
- Discuss logistics of accommodations with students and provide what is needed in a timely manner
- Expectation of confidentiality
- Strive to ensure accessibility of all aspects of the course
- Contact the student and/or SAS if there are questions or concerns
