

General Note Taking Tips

Textbook Notetaking

? Write questions on Sticky note while reading textbook and add them to your notebook afterwards to ask about them in class

 Turn online chapters into PDFs and then print them out to take notes on

Lecture Notetaking

 If slides are given before class, print them out to write on during lecture. This will make it easier to be present during class, and you will be less likely to miss key information

? Write questions in the margins or on a sticky note during class to refer back to later

Reviewing Notes

 Use a summary at the end of each chapter to give yourself a review of the chapter and to test your memory

 Write a vocab list at the end of each chapter to review and turn into notecards

 Ask an Ai site that you *trust* to create APPLICATION-BASED quizzes to test your knowledge

General Tips

 Find out your learning style and use it to your advantage

 Find a notetaking method or style that works best for you and your academic needs

★ Use a key of symbols to draw attention to specific things in your notes, for example

★ = main idea

? = confusion/question

 = connection to another concept

! = important or surprising claim
