

Physical/Mobility Disabilities

Cedar Crest College provides reasonable accommodations to qualified students with disabilities. In order to provide the most appropriate accommodations, documentation of the student's condition/disability is necessary.

Students requesting accommodations on the basis of a *Physical Disability* (mobility, dexterity etc.) should provide documentation from medical professionals such as physicians, neurologists, physiatrists or orthopedic specialists. **Documentation in the form of a narrative report (typed on letterhead, dated and signed by the qualified professional, including license number when applicable) should include, but not be limited to including, the following:**

- A clear identification of the diagnosed condition(s)
- A description of the evaluative process(es) used to determine the diagnosis
- Symptoms, severity and expected duration of the condition
- An assessment of the functionally limiting manifestations of the condition(s) for which accommodations are being requested
- A description of how the student's condition impacts functioning in an academic (learning & living) environment
- Side effects, of prescribed medications, that may impact the student's ability to learn and suggestions for accommodations related to these limitations
- Recommendations regarding how the functionally limiting manifestations of the condition(s) may be accommodated in the academic environment (learning & living)
