

Using the Online Form to Make a Testing Appointment Request

You must be approved for testing accommodations in order to make an appointment for testing, with accommodations, in Academic Services. By testing, we mean timed assessments called tests, exams or quizzes. Before making an appointment, please reach the Accommodated Testing Appointment Instructions on the Disability Resources page of My Cedar Crest.

To make a testing appointment, sign into My Cedar Crest, select Current Students (top menu), select Academic Services (left menu), then select Disability Resources (left menu). At the top right of the Disability Resources page, you will see a section titled "Accommodated Testing Appointment Request". Please read the information in this section, then select "Continue to form." On the next page, please read the information about "Test Accommodations for Students with Disabilities", check the "I Agree" box and select "Continue to form." You will then see the form below.

Your Student ID Number and Name will automatically appear. Please enter a cell phone number so that we can contact you in case there is a last minute issue. Select your semester, such as 2019-2020 Acad Yr – Fall. Your courses for that semester will be listed in the drop-down immediately following the semester field. Choose the course for which you have testing. Enter the date the class is scheduled to take the test/quiz. Enter the time the class is scheduled to take the test/quiz. If you are requesting to take the test/quiz on a different day and/or at a different time, please enter the requested testing date and requested testing time. You will then need to provide an explanation about why you are not taking it on the same day and/or at the same time as the class (use the provided text box). Please indicate whether or not the appointment request is for testing in an online course. If it is, use the textbox provided to explain why you need to take the test/quiz in Academic Services. Under "Equipment Used", mark any specialized equipment you are approved to use for the test/quiz. You must have an approved accommodation for the equipment in order to request it. Once you have completed the request form, click on the "Submit" button. If you make an error, you may cancel the request and start over.

Once you submit your request, a copy of the request is automatically emailed to Academic Services as well as your instructor. This allows Academic Services to schedule your testing space and your instructor to provide the testing materials. We require that students schedule testing with at least 24 business (not counting weekends) hours-notice for this process to run smoothly; otherwise, we may not be able to administer testing. Please note that you should arrive at the Academic Services office (Cressman Library, Rm. 322) at least ten minutes early and be prepared to lock all of your belongings (including cell phones, smart watches, pencil cases/bags, etc.) in a locker.

Students are responsible for following the Honor Code while testing. The 2019-2020 Student Handbook (page 5) provides the following information about the Honor Code:
